Initiated in Switzerland in 2008 and founded in 2010 by Bill Liao and Marie-Noëlle Keijzer, WeForest is an internatioanlk network, a Belgian association (asbl/vzw) and a US501(c)3 charity.

WeForest has created a holistic solution to cooling down the earth. In the process of doing so, it is transforming the lives of some the world's poorest people.

#### 3. Grounded in Science

The charity is driven by the scientific estimation that when 20 million km2 of forest would be replenished in equatorial regions, this would add 2% cloud cover to the Earth. This would protect the earth from warming during a critical stage when h manity is transitioning to a world that works for all living things.

WeForest has developed a model that allows corporates to "plant trees" while increasing profits. Our pioneering "buy 2 get one tree" model has been successfully deployed by many of our supporters. To put the "icing on the cake" the purchase is also tax deductible in the USA and most of Europe.

#### 8. Forests restored for the long term that change people's lives

WeForest's planting approach involves integrated landscape solutions that serve to tackle both reforestation and poverty reduction. To this end the charity works with local partners who pay attention to stakeholder engagement, capacity building,

environmental and social justice. Different projects and regions require varying degrees of oversight, training and governance

Kenneth Kalimoto, a carpenter who wants to plant trees for timber and cleaner air, has planted 50 trees on his farm during the past 2012 planting season.

His farm is located in a village of the Kafubu Block in.

### 9. A diversity of countries and types of forests:

- Brazil (Atlantic forest restoration of biodiversity corridors)
- Burkina Faso (Sahelian restoration of highly degraded land)
- Ethiopia (Udo escarpment reforestation)
- Madagascar (Mangrove reforestation)
- Tanzania (Permaculture in rural Mara region)
- Zambia (Luanshya smallholder conservation farming)
- Kenya (Mount Kenya reforestation).

Like with any other investment, risks are mitigated by diversification, and WeForest has expanded its sites from 8 active in 2013 to 10 this year. In 2018 the plan is to have 12 active sites considering this an optimal number to mitigate against risk of unforeseen project low performance and need to additional capacity and flexibility.




