2. HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE YEAR

Over 7,5 million trees

2.337.455 trees were added during 2014, totaling 7.506.333 trees since 2009.

An area almost the size of Manhattan

1.776 ha were restored in 2014, totaling 5.176 ha since 2010¹.

This area represents 88% of the size of Manhattan (59km²)!

A triple digit growth once again

In 2014 WeForest received a total of €709.464€, a 143% growth versus 2013.

In Summary: total trees planted at the end of 2014: 7.5 million or the equivalent of 5.176 ha restored.

Focus remains corporate donors (87% of income in 2014); individual contributions represented the remaining 13% with 1 large donation for operations. WF received no public funds in 2014.

Overheads as an investment in growth

2014 showed a 143% growth in revenue, yet these results were short of 6,5% versus target (€709.464 actuals vs. 750.000€ budget).

The overheads were budgeted at 31% in order to build a team for future growth: we were able to keep the actual overheads slightly under budget (28%).

The WeForest accounts are audited by **Deloitte** every year since 2011.

3. PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS AND IMPACT

A project portfolio in constant evolution

In 2014 WF funded 7 projects, completed 2 sites and started 2 new ones.

7 active projects in 2014

1. INDIA - Restoring India's cloud forest. New in 2014!
A total of 416.500 trees were planted and protected (500ha).

2. BURKINA FASO - Greening The Sahel Desert.
A total of 1.035.208 new trees have grown (from sown seeds) during 2014 (1035ha), creating an estimate of 3 direct employments (due to the fact that tractors are used to prepare the soil and no nurseries are needed).
3. TANZANIA - Permaculture at the center of landscape restoration.
A total of 104.457 valuable trees (super-food, fruit trees) were grown in the nursery and distributed to farmers to plant during 2014, creating an estimate of 17 direct employments.
4. BRAZIL- Restoring the Atlantic Forest. New in 2014!
A total of 64.290 trees were planted during 2014 after seedlings were grown in local community nurseries led by women.
5. ZAMBIA – Planting trees with prisoners in the Ndola prison.
A total of 17.000 trees were planted for timber near the prison during 2014 in order to bring additional long-term income for healthcare and better food.
6. ETHIOPIA – In the Rift Valley, South of Ethiopia.
A total of 300.000 trees were planted during 2014, creating an estimate of 29 direct employments.
7. MADAGASCAR– Mangrove restoration in the North West of the island.
A total of 400.000 mangrove trees were planted during 2014, creating an estimate of 76 direct jobs.

Stopping 2 test projects

WeForest is thriving to select planting partners that can guarantee the long-term survival of the trees and a solid reporting about the tree growth. When not satisfactory or when the initial target is complete, the project stops.

2 sites (Madagascar/dry deciduous trees) and India (in Tamil Nadu) did not bring satisfactory results in terms of reporting quality so we decided to stop funding them. Total trees planted in these 2 test sites were quite limited (280.000 trees in Madagascar and 7.350 trees in India).

4. DONORS AND PARTNERS THAT MAKE IT POSSIBLE

27 corporates supported the WeForest planting activities in 2014, including 6 global brands (Brabantia, Coty, Delifrance, Europcar, Marriott and Daikin).

A generous contributor (from the UK) donated for operations and supported the salary of our first employee for 2 years (2013 and 2014): we are very thankful to her for helping us professionalize our administration, which was until then relying mainly on volunteers.

The top 10 donors contributed to 90% of all donations (Atlas Copco, Brabantia, Delifrance, Daikin, Marcelle S, Delifrance, Geoaxioma, Illustration, Eneco and Kwadraat).

SalesForce and Deloitte

A new business system for contact & account management was implemented in June 2014 WF (CRM). SalesForce gave WF 10 free licenses as part of their CSR strategy. Deloitte Belgium helped WF pro bono to implement it.

Dropbox

WF received 50 licenses for unlimited data storage.

5. TEAM

A growing team of professionals: 6 people worked for WF in 2014, (representing 4,5 FTE), located in Belgium, Germany, Ireland and UK. 12 volunteers contributed their expertise throughout the year.

6. GROWING A MOVEMENT

The NYDF (New York Declaration on Forests) from September 23rd, 2014 under the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki Moon's leadership (endorsed by dozens of governments, 30 of the world's biggest companies, and more than 50 influential civil society and indigenous organizations) called for action. It called for **350 million ha to be restored by 2030** (10% of the planet's degraded soil: the equivalent of 41% of Brazil or a little more than the total surface of India (106%). It also called for the protection (to stop deforestation) of another 177m ha in order to stay under the 2°C temperature increase. This was an important milestone for the reforestation movement: it set the scene and the objective for the action we are undertaking.

The WF Mission: "WeForest aims to contribute to the scaling-up, monitoring and reporting on the impact of forest and landscape restoration, contributing to the realization of the NYDF (New York Declaration on Forests) and the Bonn Challenge".

Joining Al Gore's Climate Reality Corps: on June 17, 2014, Marie-Noëlle Keijzer, the WF CEO, joined a 3-day training by Al Gore in Johannesburg (SAF) to continue spreading the word on the climate urgency.
